They also punch each other out, which is kind of funny because they're throwin' some serious punches back and forth until, finally, someone (usually the good guy) gets knocked out....and...yeah...he gets knocked out right before something big is about to happen, which should lead to his death. As a matter of fact, that's how each chapter ends...and when the next one begins...it starts off by showing you how he managed to make his escape.
