Iggy Pop is one of the godfathers, if not THE godfather of punk rock music. The Stooges were making angry, aggression fueled rock almost a decade before the punk movement came into full fruition. Iggy's solo career has als been extremely successful and shows no signs of slowing down any time soon. If you aren't already versed in the music of Iggy Pop or The Stooges, you have now got yourself a priority. "Lust For Life" is not an official DVD catalog everything that the skinny little man with the big stage presence has ever done, but the release of some old footage from 1986 that somehow went unseen. Taking you back to the "Blah Blah Blah" years, this forty five minute documentary-esque video contains several live performances and interviews with Iggy and former Stooges guitarist Ron Asheton. Iggy and Ron offer insight as to what led to the formation, and ultimately the demise, of one of rock music's most influential bands. There is also some footage of Iggy appearing on talk shows and voicing his opinion c the preconceived notions of rock and roll naysayers and the likes of The Sex Pistols and the punk rock movement of '77. I also learned a few things that I didn't already know. For example, and I'm a little ashamed of myself for not knowing this, I learned that David Bowie, one of my personal idols, not only produced Iggy's first two solo records, also played keyboard/piano in Iggy's touring band in support of the records. The only drawbacks of the DVD are the running time and the fact that there are no subtitles, as the narration is some foreign language that I did not understand. Other than that, this DVD is a good opportunity to get schooled on one of rock's greatest performers.
