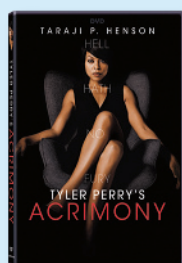

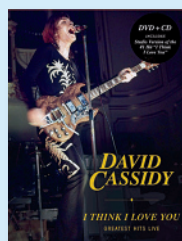
## UNFORGETTABLE ROAD TRIP

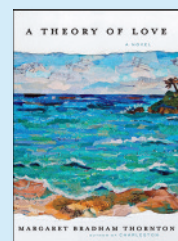

## What to do if there's a DRUG RECALL

**M**EDICATIONS are tested for effectiveness and safety by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration before they hit the market — but the FDA's supervision doesn't end there. If the quality of a drug is ever called into question, a recall can be issued.

Reasons for this may include:

- If a health risk is discovered after a medication has already been released.
- If a drug was contaminated during production or distribution.
- Mislabeled packaging that doesn't correctly identify the contents or gives unclear dosing instructions.
- Poor manufacturing that affects purity or potency.

If you have a drug that's been recalled, you should stop taking it and return the remaining medication to the pharmacy for safe disposal. Ask about getting a refund or a replacement for the recalled product.

Get in touch with your doctor immediately if you experience unusual symptoms — especially if you think they may be related to the recalled medication.
