

After the Misfits broke up—but before he met Rick Rubin— Glenn Danzig kept the devil lock alive with

Samhain, the band he would eventually realign and name after himself. Though crappy by today's standards, the amateur footage here provides a rare live glimpse of Evil Elvis' crucial transitional phase.

With chief leather daddy Rob Halford back on the microphone, it was only a matter of time before Priest unleashed another live beast from



VARIOUS ARTISTS OZZFEST 10TH ANNIVERSARY


(CLEAR CHANNEL)

*** BLEEDING THROUGH WOLVES AMONG SHEER


(TRUSTKILL)

Shot documentarystyle on the band's home turf, this forfans-only DVD follows

Bleeding Through on a guided tour of the beaches, tattoo parlors, and Del Taco parking lots of the O.C., including individual

interviews with all six members and a sneak preview of three tracks from the band's forthcoming album.

TESTAMENT

(EAGLE ROCK)

Back in action for the first time in 13 years, the original Testament lineup tears London a new one with a virile set of thrash

classics. As the only band from the original Bay Area brain trust that didn't go soft, Testament prove they don't really need to prove anything.

A DECADE IN THE
GRAVE (METAL BLADE)
A box set
featuring four

CDs of visceral, mid-paced death metal from the grizzly side project turned full-time band formed by ex-Cannibal Corpse singer Chris Barnes and former members of Obituary and Death. The set includes early demos and two new songs, plus a DVD of eight videos and 11 live recordings from 2004 and 2005.

FRESH FRUIT FOR ROTTING
VEGETABLES IMANIFESTOR

Raw, volatile, and scathingly political, Dead Kennedys' first album was a punk landmark that incorporated elements of surf rock, Sixties garage rock, and novelty music. Unsurprisingly, frontman Jello Biafra, who was sued by his bandmates for withholding royalties, did not participate in this reissue.

EXTRAS: A 60-minute DVD documentary of new interviews and vintage footage.



DIMMU

After the complex, symphonic rage of 2003's Death Cult Armageddon, Dimmu Borgir revisited their more primitive roots by rerecording their second album. They hired producer Peter Tägtgren and Mayhem drummer Hellhammer to help breathe new life into the disc, which was dismissed upon its 1996 release because of poor production.

EXTRAS: A DVD featuring a 30minute set from Ozzfest 2004.
