Terror in America is a fans only look at the performance style of GG Allin captured in three live shows in 1993, before a fatal heroin overdose.

The first show is tame by GG standards, but during the second show he shoves both male and female fans faces under his American flag loin cloth, and then sticks a microphone up his butt before putting it in his mouth. Then he grabs a woman in a skirt and screams into her privates. In the third concert, he bashes a fan in the head with a microphone stand, which could have killed the guy. That's the GG Allin we all know and love.

The filming is shaky, frequently out of focus and dark, while the audio is mostly treble guitar fuzz and barking dog vocals. Those who aren't familiar with GG should look at the 1994 documentary Hated: GG Allin and the Murder Junkies. Still, die hard fans of GG Allin and extreme performance should peek at this.
