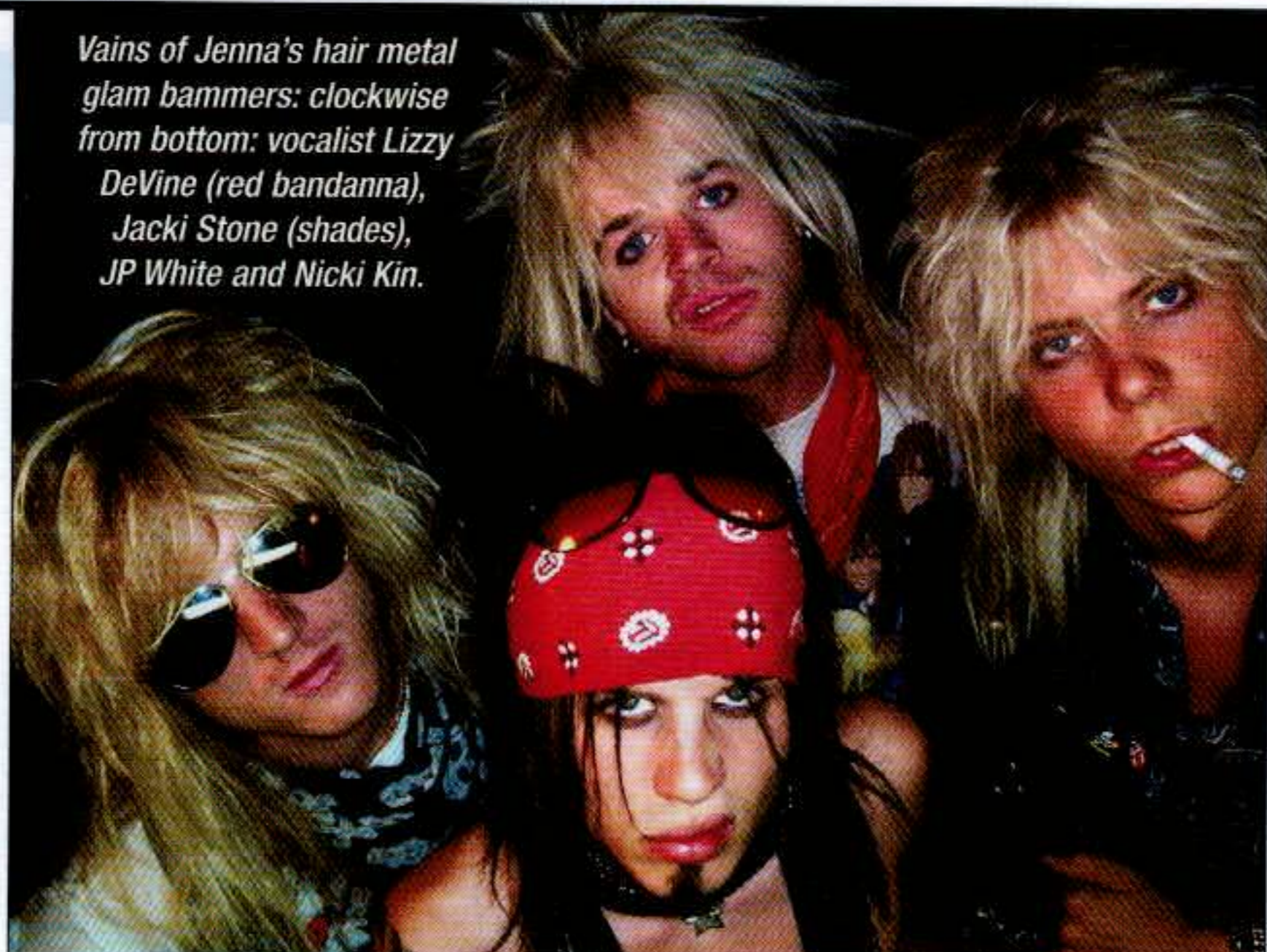

laid over there," he says. "If you go out on a Friday night in Sweden and don't go home with anyone, you're a loser."

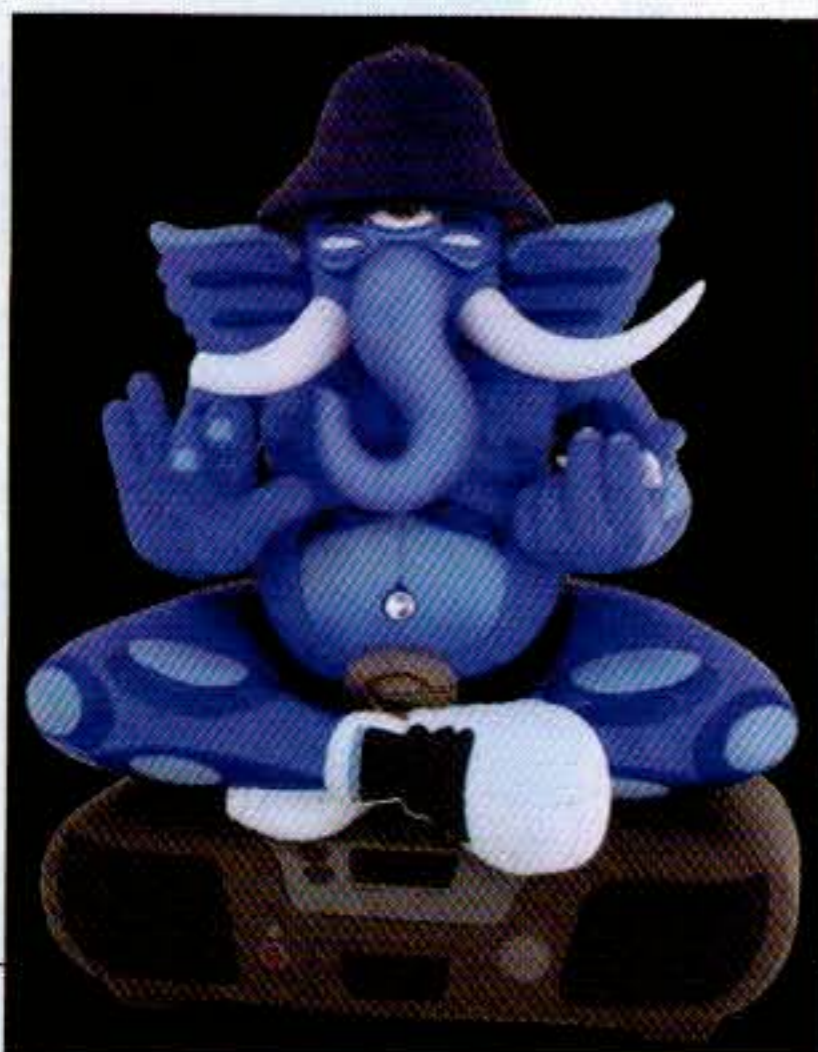
Still, reasonable substitutes are acceptable. "JP just had sex with a girl who's supposed to be in HUSTLER," adds Lizzy,

### THREE FROM PUNK'S SECOND WAVE

Music Video Distributors and Secret Films bring you DVDs from three of punk rock's second-wave stalwarts. First up is Charged G.B.H.'s *On Stage—City Baby Attacked By Rats*, which offers the venerable spiky-haired lads in concert at London's Coronet in 2004. Next up is *The Adventures of Sham 69*, featuring the Hershams Boys live at Brighton's Concorde Club in 2002. Saving the best for last, it's a "handheld & rigidly digital disc," *Stiff Little Fingers in Concert*, showcasing the respected Irish punk pioneers at various venues on their 1998 Hope Street Tour. All three discs are in Dolby 5.1 and feature interviews with band members. —T.F.
