Bad Brains: Live at CBGB (1982)

In certain circles, they're considered the most significant hardcore band of all time, for reasons both political and musical. Undeniably, Bad Brains held court in the Reagan-era punk scene. And now the Corktown Tavern revisits the glory days of their hardcore-reggae-ska with a screening of the new concert DVD, *Bad Brains: Live at CBGB (1982)*. The doc offers rarely seen concert footage from the Hardcore Festival, which took place at the famed CBGB during Christmas of 1982, and the film features 17 tracks and bonus material, including a series of 1982 interviews.
