
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A Film about The Pixies DVD

Back in the fall of 2004, I got a surprise phone call from a friend of mine. "I've got two tickets for The Pixies", he yelled running out of breath. "How much are they?", I asked in a non-chalant manner. "\$50". "\$50?!", I grumbled. "That can't be. Forget it, I'll pass." I didn't want to go back and revisit a band that was already perfect during their prime 15 years prior. Back in '89, we both saw the band at the [non existent] Apocalypse Club in Toronto. House was packed. Just over 300 people

packed the over-heated club. We were both standing on tables, holding on to the roof of the club, while on stage the group rocked the house solid. While touring their "Doolittle" album, the band played most of their up-to-then small catalogue. For two solid hours, they shook the place down and ravaged everyone present. People were hooked. Best of all, with dozens of people outside the venue begging for tickets to the show, the ticket price was a mere \$15. Two years later, I saw them again during the "Bossanova" tour at a much larger venue, but by that time, they had lost their charm. The band was falling apart at the seams. Thirteen years later, they would reform, re-group and embark on a world-wide tour. Directed by Steven Cantor and Matthew Galkin, "loudQUIETloud" DVD shows their reunion tour from the front as well as back of the stage. It's the behind the stage material that makes this movie so unique. The tour was an unheard of success. Called "Pixies Sellout Tour", each date the band played sold out in unheard of, record periods of time. This time around they were playing to a younger crowd. Sure, the old-timers were there. People who grew up with them look ecstatic during the crowd shots but it's the newcomers that are equally freaky and tear-eyed. The film makes an attempt at explaining the personal rifts between individual band members. Obviously, the strongest tension was the one between vocalist/guitarist Black Francis [aka Frank Black or Charles Thompson] and bassist Kim Deal. Creative differences drove them apart to the point where The Breeders became Deal's creative outlet, while Black evoked on a successful solo career of his own. Drummer David Lovering gets a couple of killer scenes where he discusses his life after Pixies. He's become a magician and looks for lost treasure on the beaches of California. Guitarist Joey Santiago is raising a family and it looks like the reunion tour came at a perfect time for the guy [perhaps there were financial issues we're not made aware of]. As a recovering alcoholic Kim Deal [who is accompanied on the entire tour by her sister Kelley] makes a condition that no alcohol be kept backstage. While David Lovering's father passes away, no member of the band is shown to truly feel his pain [Black Francis finally confronts him and strongly suggests rehab]. Then you start to realize something. These four people have gone through such a rich history with each other, redefining rock music at the time. Yet, for all of this, they have not learned how to communicate with each other. On stage, they're one tight quartet. They sound nearly as great as they did when I recall seeing them life. The arrangements are tight and the songs rock solid. But off-stage, they're four separate individuals, with less than nothing in common. The film is best encapsulated by one quote. Black Francis is talking to a reporter on the phone and he sums everything up by saying, "We don't talk to each other that much and it's not because we don't like each other. It's just the kind of people that we are." It's so damn tragic that great musicians on-stage are so lousy and careless with each other when the crowds disperse.
