The Harder " " is at the stage where Rocksteady has begun to shed it's Ska roots and "Rockers" begins during the Roots Rock phase of Reggae and captures the evolution into the more politically charged era of Reggae. They are both entertaining and to be sure the production values in "Rockers" are of a much higher quality than "T.H.T.C.".

"T.H.T.C" has several jams from Toots & The Maytals so big ups for that but in "Rockers"there's the great Burning Spear so it's hard for me to personally pick one over the other. Both of these flicks have a similar story (or lack of LOL) that are basically just set ups that are showcases for the music and performers which is alright with I and I.

A recent flick you might want to check out is called "Dancehall Queen". It is filled with excellent performances and a thin plot to tie them together. It has mainly current Dancehall stuff like Buju Banton, General Degree, Carlene and more.
