Like many bands of their period, such as King Crimson and Yes, Roxy members loved to also work on solo projects. It allowed these multi-talented players to vent steam, explore new territory and then bring it back.

Probably one of the most brilliant of these spin-offs was Manzanera/Eno's band 801. Besides the two Roxy members, it included a veritable A-list of super sidemen, among them Bill MacCormack (bass), Francis Monkman (keys), Lloyd Watson (slide) and especially Simon Phillips (drums). Manzanera has apparently gotten the rights to all their live and studio work over the last three decades and will now be releasing or re-releasing all he has through his

own record label, Expression.

Quite frankly, if he had to start anywhere in the 801 library, Live is as good as it gets. Based on a concert the band did back in 1976, Manzanera proves why he's one of the true unsung <u>heroes</u> in the guitar world. His mastery at controlling distortion, sustain and compression makes his guitar virtually sing. If you don't believe, check out the opening track "Lagrima." Basically an unaccompanied solo, the song straddles the line between German space rock and raw edged punk.

Then the band cuts into a cover of the Beatles' "Tomorrow Never Knows," with Eno on vocals and it's all over. You have to be deaf not to be completely hooked by 801's pulsing, hypnotic and still powerful version of the Fab Four's attempt at Indian raga.

From there, the record proceeds to highlight many of the pieces Manzanera and Eno had recorded up to that time. On Eno's front, this includes such notorious pieces as "Baby's On Fire, Fat Lady of Limbourgh, Sombre Lizards" and "Third Uncle." Eno's vocals are in seriously strong form for a guy who had recently suffered a collapsed lung.
