

"B.E.E.R." is a Chuck Berry styled rock n roll song & overall this record is just a total blast to listen to because it's so quirky!

The Spokane Punk / New Wave scene in the 80's was an interesting mix of damaged art students and odd ball kids who had a vision with no where to really direct their attentions to other than starting a band & making music for the other misfits in the area.

Most of these bands you won't know... there's a few familiar faces but odds are most people will not know any of these artists unless you truly love the underground punk bands from the 80's.

The archival footage is super cool & in many cases these clips have never seen the light of day outside of Seattle!

The film maker did a really great job of adding cool scenes to the interview segments which add a bit o' juice to the scenes and as a complete body of work this movie is a great documentary on a scene that's long since passed. If you didn't live in Seattle you do not know anything about this scene so on that level it's cool to see some forgotten bands get a final recognition even if it's long after the bands have finished up & are over.

The bonus footage is cool too because there's outtakes, random mini films & you definitely get a good value with this package!
