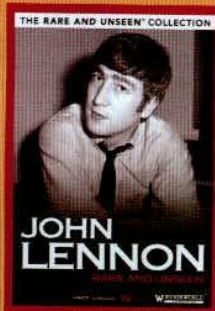

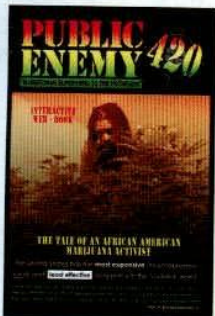

Perhaps more importantly it manages to capture the whimsy and humor of Lennon that is often lost in favor of references to his controversial relationship with his wife Yoko Ono.
