

But as I said the film is so awesomely bad it's crazy. The acting is very spotty. However, I do think John Brace does a great job as Mike. There are some comedic/dark humor moments that sometimes work and sometimes don't. Also not only do you have to pay close attention to the details of just how Mike ends up with all the weapons he has nearing the end of the film. You better set yourself up for one of the un-logical endings you're ever going to see. I'm not sure if that's due to some bad editing or what, but it holds things back a bit. That all being said, I think you should all see this movie at least once.

#### The Conclusion

The movie would go on to spawn two official sequels from Ritter titled Wicked Games and Screaming for Sanity: Truth or Dare 3. It also has an unofficial sequel called Writer's Block. Not sure about any of those, but this is a keeper for many uncommon reasons. I also should probably note that playing the role of the young Mike in this film is Backstreet Boy A.J. McLean. I kid you not.

So do yourself a favor and pick this cult classic up for a very good price over at MVD. It's been a long time coming and finally the new DVD is here.
