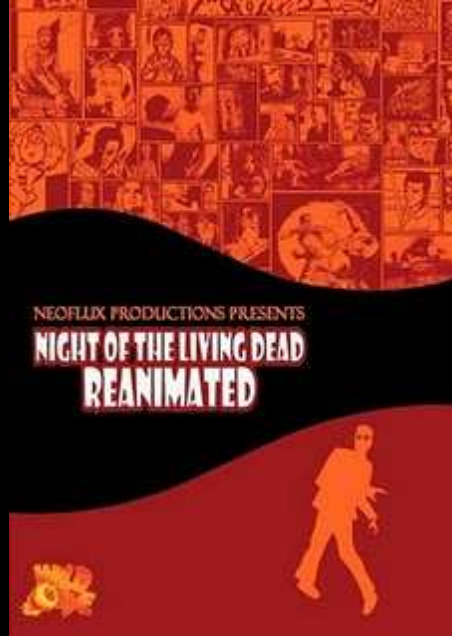

Night of the Living Dead is one of the greatest horror movies of all time. Night of the Living Dead Reanimated is not. For those not familiar with the movie it is basically the audio track of the original public domain George Romero classic with different artists reinterpreting the scenes. For example one scene might start off with stuffed toy actors

in the role then within seconds it switches to a flat panel comic scene then it may switch to another art scene drawn with the actors actually in motion. There are dozens of different artists that worked on the movie varying from any type of hand drawn comic you've ever seen to stuffed animals, to action figures and even sock puppets! I won't get into the story because it's a classic and if you've never seen the original then you need to close down this browser turn off the computer and get to watching!

When I first heard of the project I thought it had mad potential of handled correctly.

Unfortunately most of the movies was a jumbled mess. The main issue I had was how frequent art styles changed. I would really get into a particular style then literally 10-30 seconds later it would switch to something else. I actually liked a majority of the styles but I did hate a few of them. Art is totally subjective but I thought all the abstract art crap they had was terrible and didn't work in a narrative movie. It was so bad the first 10 minutes or so with the classic graveyard scene and the "He's coming to get you Barbara" was almost incomprehensible to figure out what was going on. Now half way through the movie it did get a little better or

maybe my brain just got used to it. Overall though, I cant recommend the movie to even die hard zombie fans. If they would have just chosen to go with 8 or 9 of the best styles and let them play out for a few minutes each, then the movie had potential to be awesome, but alas they did not, so I have to give it a thumbs down. Maybe they can learn from their mistakes and hit it out the park with their next project.
