Paul Is Dead: Still Alive

The appetite for Beatle culture is still strong, as evidenced by a New York exhibition of rare band photos and the \$1.2 million sale of John Lennon's handwritten lyrics to "A Day in the Life." Another clue: the enduring popularity of the urban legend known as "Paul Is Dead."

This infamous urban legend has inspired two new releases: a DVD documentary that claims to have new evidence of McCartney's death, and a darkly comic novel that re-imagines the Fab Four -- as zombies. Rock historian and *Rolling Stone* contributing editor [Anthony DeCurtis](#) joins us for a look at the wild claims behind the "Paul Is Dead" myth.
