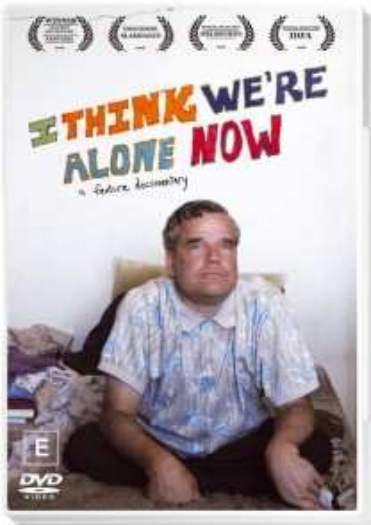

I Think We're Alone Now follows two individuals who have an extreme obsession with singer Tiffany. The first one introduced is Jeff. You can tell right from the start that there is something mentally wrong with him and later you learn that he has Asperger Syndrome. He reads from a newspaper clipping of an incident with Tiffany where he was arrested and charged but he honestly remembers the situation differently. He sees himself as Tiffany's friend. I want to say there is a beautiful innocence to him but I'm too creeped out by his disillusion.

The second stalker we meet is an 'intersex' named Kelly. She reveals (although it isn't hard to spot) that she was born as a hermaphrodite (born as both a male and a female). She also goes into her intense feelings for Tiffany; admitting that they are destined to be together.

I think this documentary would be amazing even without the stalking portion of it. An inside look into these two interesting individuals is jaw-dropping on its own. Adding their intense obsession with Tiffany only makes the story more creepy. At one point, Jeff explains how it is one of the highest Japanese honors for someone to bestow upon you a Katana (a large sword) and 5 Chrysanthemums; which he attempted to do to Tiffany!! Security obviously stopped him but in his mind, that was normal...he did not see anything strange about it. And his meeting Tiffany at a convention, you could tell she knew who he was and you could tell she was creeped out. But Jeff had no clue (possibly an effect of the Aspergers). He kept talking and talking to Tiffany; at one point, asking her if she needed his hotel room number.

Enough of Jeff, let's get on to Kelly. After a bad bicycle accident, she was in a coma and dreamed of being with Tiffany forever (this was before she knew who Tiffany was). When she awoke and saw Tiffany's picture, she recognized her and knew it was fate. Other than being socially awkward and odd-looking, Kelly could have had a normal life. I think her problems begin when she was a child in a split household not knowing whether she was a boy or a girl. I think her Tiffany obsession is more just trying to achieve some sort of relationship normalcy. Unfortunately, it develops into a mad obsession and you could see it in her eyes when she said she loves Tiffany all the way down to her bone marrow, that she meant it.
