


Disneynature: Oceans

Pitch: Discovery Channel better watch their back because there's a big, new player in the epic nature documentary game...

Why Buy? Pierce Brosnan narrates this beautiful and amazing look at the world's oceans and the lives they contain. The images are often breathtaking in their power and intricacy... one shot that transitions from a star-filled sky to a drop of water filled with sea urchin larva is particularly inspired. Docs like these may seem like old-hat thanks to some brilliant releases from Discovery/BBC in the past several years, but when done right each new one is like a fantastic reintroduction to the incredible world we live in. There are too many great scenes to single out, but some of the best include the spider crabs, the blanket octopus, and the walrus mother holding her little one in the water like any human parent would. And as an odd bonus several of the scenes at the ocean floor almost feel like a Jim Henson production.


