



**"David Bowie: Rare and Unseen"**

This collection of old clips, interviews and rehearsal footage of rock icon David Bowie is only for the most die-hard fans. The segments ramble on without much energy. British TV interviewer Russell Harty tries to engage a slightly dazed Bowie via satellite linkup in the mid-1970s, but it's obvious that Harty is too square and clueless for Bowie's tastes, so the interview falls flat. A much-older Bowie, grinning and wizened, pops in a few times during the interview to interject that he was completely out of it back then and had no idea what was going on. In segments, Bowie reflects on his prodigious drug use and other outrageous behavior. Bowie remains unquestionably a rock god, but we don't need this jumbled DVD collection to appreciate him.
