History Lesson Part 1: Punk Rock in Los Angeles in 1984

Filed by then-teenager Dave Travis, History Lesson Part 1 captures a handful of L.A.'s famed punk pioneers during the final year of the movement. The DVD shows rare live footage of the Meat Puppets, the Minutemen, Twisted Roots and Redd Kross.

The concert footage is interspersed with interview clips with Mike Watt (Minutemen), Jeff and Steve McDonald (Redd Kross), Cris and Curt Kirkwood (Meat Puppets), Paul Roessler (Screamers, Twisted Roots, DC3) and Hellin (Killer) Roessler. Some good footage and interviews, a must-see for all fans of the movement. Exclusively through MVD distributors.

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David Bowie: Rare and Unseen

This hour-long video features, like the title says, rare and unseen interview footage with David Bowie in the mid-70s, after Ziggy Stardust and before his massive success in the early 80s with songs like "China Girl." As always, Bowie is enigmatic and difficult to nail down. The highlight of this compilation is his live interview with British TV icon Russell Harty.
