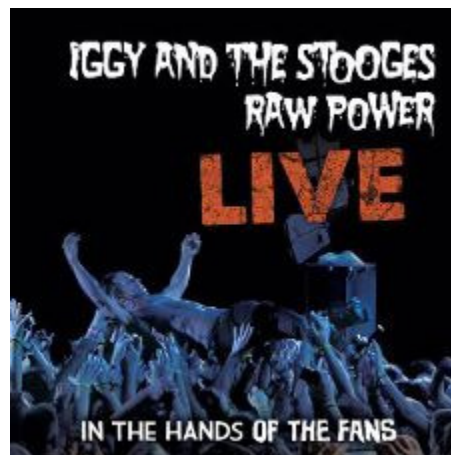

Known as one of rock music's more innovative bands, Iggy and the Stooges has come up with a novel idea, give six fans cameras and have them film Iggy and the Stooges reunion show. It is creative, and works on some levels, even if the production values look a bit amateurish.

Of course it is the "raw" part that the band sought to capture, and they certainly did that. In some ways, it does make the concert experience a bit more authentic than having pro cameras shoved in the face of musicians as they perform in a packed house. And let's face it, Iggy and the Stooges is not a band we need to see in HD. There are plenty of extras, including a segment where the band interacts with the lucky fans. It gives a unique insight of the band.

Musically, it's raw, fun and powerful. Longtime fans of the band will absolutely love hearing "Raw Power" performed in its entirety, albeit in a different running order.
