

Josh Rubin's fascinating documentary on singer and musician Wild Man Fischer—part-time Frank Zappa cohort, full-time mental patient—is a scream. We mean that literally, by the way; Fischer does a LOT of shrieking.

Once again, a heroine turns forlornly to prostitution in a Mizoguchi film—but the poise and emotional wallop of this entry, one of the director's best, make it a keeper. Kurosawa regular Toshiro Mifune appears in a small role as a samurai.
