

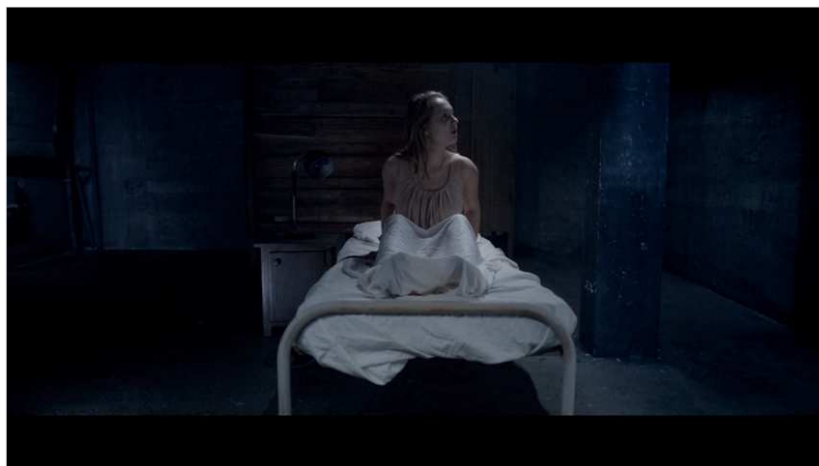
Claustrofobia (2011)
