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## Unauthorized Plugs Into Rock 'n' Roll Comics' Controversial Past



"Todd Loren, First Amendment advocate or lying sack of shit?" asks *The Comics Journal* publisher Gary Groth in the trailer for *Unauthorized: The Story of Rock 'N' Roll Comics*.

It's not Shakespeare, but it is the existential question behind director Ilko Davidov's 2005 documentary, out April 24 on DVD. It's also the enduring query surrounding the mysteriously murdered Loren's infamously unauthorized Revolutionary Comics, which contained biographies of groundbreaking bands like The Grateful Dead and Pink Floyd (who liked his work) and lessers like Guns N' Roses and Bon Jovi (who eventually sued).

With input from Alice Cooper, Mojo Nixon and more, *Unauthorized: The Story of Rock 'N' Roll Comics*examines the California Supreme Court ruling that supported Loren's controversial comics. The documentary also looks into Loren's fatal 1992 stabbing, possibly committed by Gianni Versace's killerAndrew Cunanan.
