Synopsis ~ This documentary tells the unbelievable story of Todd Loren, San Diego-based owner of Revolutionary Comics, famous for publishing the wildly popular "Rock 'N' Roll Comics" series. The unauthorized and often controversial comics featured biographies of music groups such as KISS, the Sex Pistols and Metallica. Loved by some (Gene Simmons, Alice Cooper, Lemmy of Motörhead) and threatened by others (Axl Rose, Skid Row, New Kids on the Block), over 300 issues of Rock 'N' Roll comics were printed, embracing all music genres: Rock, Alternative, Hip-Hop, Punk and Pop and they quickly became instant collector's items. In a strange twist, Loren is found murdered in his condo in 1992, making people speculate that he may have the first victim of 'serial' killer Andrew Cunanan, leading to an absorbing mystery that still remains, UNSOLVED today.

Enigmatically playing out dually like a gracious homage to Todd

Loren while highlighting just how difficult it was for friends, foes and co-workers to be in his orbit, The Story of Rock 'n' Roll Comics is a mixture of eerie occurrences and one man's quest for freedom of the press.

And while a large part of the production spends perhaps a bit too much time on Loren's personality foibles and his inexplicable ability to antagonize rather than the journey of building an empire of ink and bands - practically every aspect of Loren's business ventures were fraught with stress, scams and salesman doubletalk - if you're ever collected, admired or even just been exposed to an issue of Rock 'n' Roll Comics, then this little rock-doc will surely hold your attention.

The healthy menu of extras brings more of the best of the worst, with highlights including a dual pair of deleted scenes with slighted artists Robert Conte and Duane Dimock, a uniquely exposed look at the "artwork" of Cynthia Plaster Caster, a few short news reports, one of which involves the announcement of Loren's brutal death, two unauthorized featurettes on comics and Todd's freedom of speech views and a great trip down metal lane with a gallery of over one hundred Rock 'N' Roll Comics covers.

So whether you're interested in the man, the music, the manuscripts, or just a morbid sense of murder curiosity, The Story of Rock 'n' Roll Comics is best told through the unfiltered lens of director Ilko Davidov, unabashed and unauthorized.
