

This is not a film that wastes time with genre references or postmodern humour but goes straight for the jugular. Plus it's brilliantly paced and finds the exactly right balance between violence, action and atmosphere. Sure, the film is not for everybody, due to its subject matter as well as in-your-face approach, but if you want to see a genre movie done just right, go and see this one!
