The Hunt reminds me of the Hostel movies mixed with Surviving the Game and Hard Target along with adding in the porn element of 8MM and any movie where a journalist is out to find a story. In this French movie, director Thomas Szczepanski gives a prelude by showing these two masked men kidnapping a man and bringing him to a warehouse where two other men are bound to chairs with hankerchiefs stuffed in their bloody mouths. The audience is then treated to the third guy's tongue being cut out before a similar hankerchief is stuffed in his now bleeding mouth.

After the prelude, our protagionist Alex is introduced. He is looking more like a photographer than a reporter when he's filming a model with a dog. Later on, he has the tools of the reporter's trade, a pen and notebook. He needs to find a story that will sell copies of the tabloid he works for or his boss will fire him since his last story didn't do the job.

His search for a story leads to his girlfriend who works in a porn video/peepshow store.
