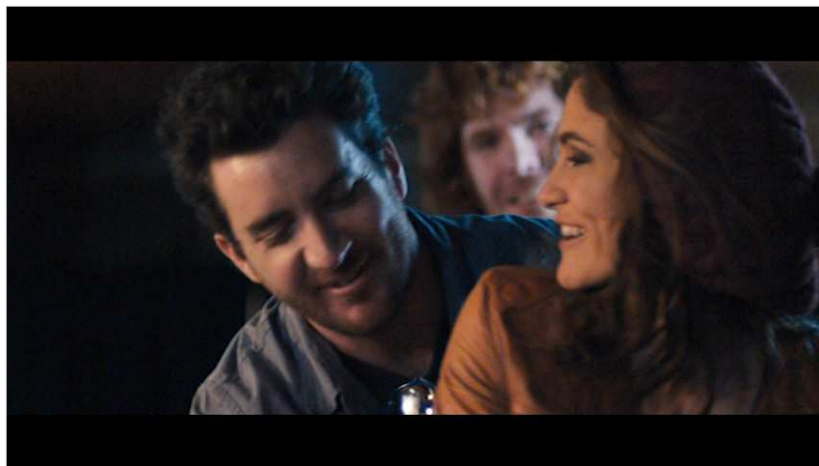


Cherry (2012)
