Originally released in '88 but available here on CD for the first time, 'Infectious Garage Disease' arrives with over two hours of material on the one disc and also containing 35 minutes of video footage and live rehearsals, twenty two demos, a twelve page booklet and a partridge in a pair tree.

Wow - either it's value for money or they are so desperate to get people to pick this up by chucking so much stuff on it that there must be something you like, right?

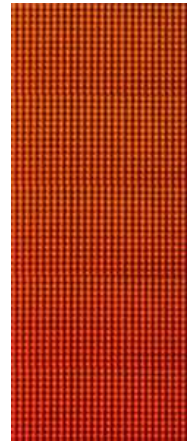
Wrong. It's breakneck hardcore that's part Slayer, part Agnostic Front, and part potty mouth with teenager-like offensive lyrics that fourteen year olds wouldn't even raise a titter to these days.

This is old school and on the odd occasion the pace is exchanged from breakneck to doom, if only for the briefest glimpse. S.O.D. did this and were gross and DRI and other such luminaries did this much better and did it first.

The blurb says that IGD were punk before it went mall on us; they spread their disease of politically incorrect songs that aren't for the weak or easily offended - well, I'm neither and I still think this stinks on a level that is an insult to punk rockers (even the shopping mall designer punks of America).
