

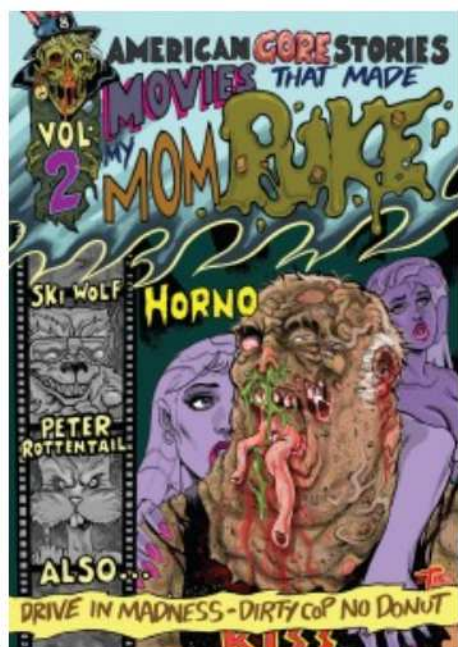

HOWS THE MOVIE?

HOWS THE MOVIE?

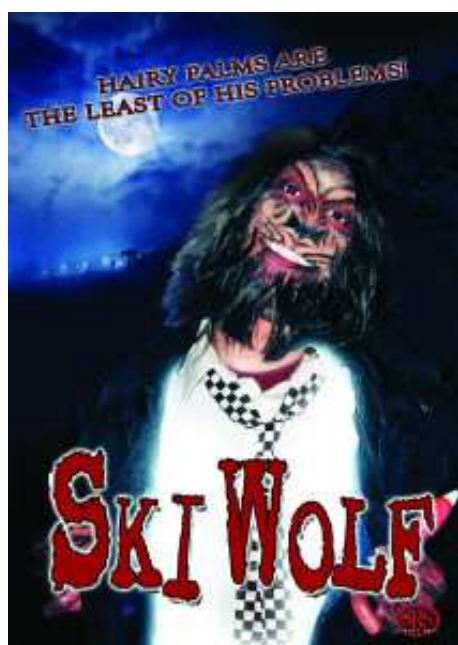

HOWS THE MOVIE?

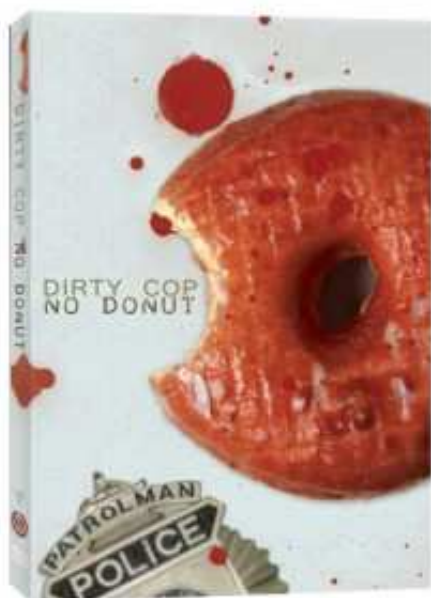
