

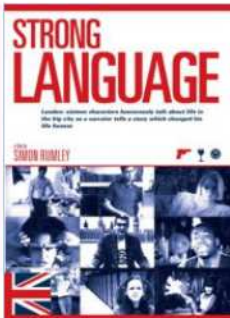
DVD Review: 'Simon Rumley Trilogy'

The first in the Rumley Trilogy is a bit like Richard Linklater's "Slacker" if the characters were unmemorable and you kept going back to them. 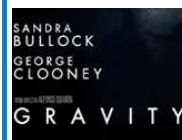
