

Penny's From Heaven has gotten positive reviews from critics who found it to be a suitably kooky sequel to Verhoeven's original. Alonso Duralde of Movies.com called it a "lunatic extravaganza" that's "exactly what you want" from a movie called Showgirls 2: Penny's From Heaven, and Rich Juzwiak from Gawker said it was "funny, stupid, and aware that it's both," and compared the movie favorably to Russ Meyer's Beyond The Valley Of The Dolls.
