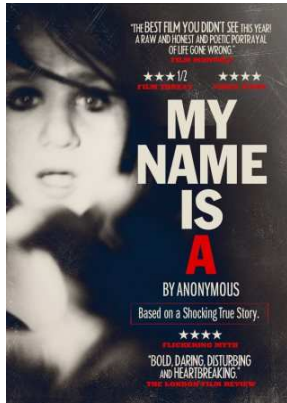

THE PLOT

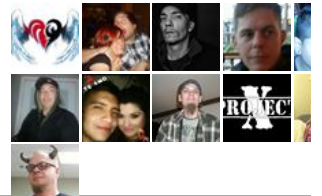
