DVD review: The Killer 4 Pack

Tis a rare occasion that one movie comes along that makes you want to tear out your eyeballs while watching it, let alone a dual-sided disc that contains two horrendous features. The odds of atrocity are dramatically increased when mentioning 3 connective meadow-muffins on one disc...and then the disastrous occurrence of 4 turds on the same DVD?

Say hello to The Killer 4 Pack - an absolutely cruel trick on the viewing public that may dare to shove this barbarity into their player, and while the subsequential trauma to your memory will be a lasting one, it cannot compare to how bad you'll feel while watching it as it plays in front of you. I'll spare everyone the appalling details of each particular film, but give you all a brief synopsis of the separate ones, followed by my take...get ready for the bloodshed.

Feature #1: The Day of the Dead - an oddly dubbed Spanish/American film directed by Ricardo Islas tells the tale of minorities in the city of Chicago that are being murdered by a group of bored hate-mongers simply by choking them to death - not by hands, but by sleeper-holds (a wrestling term for those unaware). One innocent woman looking for work in the city is lured in to the gym where the killers hang out, thinking she's on track for a cleaning job. She is brutally killed and defiled, but is she really dead? Tracked down by a detective, the group believes they can handle this small bump in the road, but there is something more spiritual at hand here, and it starts to pick off the group one by one. Ok, here's my take: this, surprisingly is the best of the 4 films in the collection (and that's not saying much)- a decent storyline, but bad acting combined with the annoying subtitle/no subtitle format of dialogue between characters is the movie's downfall.

Feature #2: Jezebeth - a fine piece of cinematic imbecility that involves a young woman who is a practicing Satanist, and she finds a 19th century diary that allows a code to be broken that will bring forth a demon from Hell. So, she unleashes two different realities, and you WILL be bored to death. The acting is so God-awful that you'll probably keep watching to witness true punishment- absolute crap.

Feature #3: Carnage: The Legend of Quiltface-yep, Quiltface...and NO, I'm not making this up. Four photography students take an extra-credit road trip to the Nevada desert (because it's SO photogenic...sarcasm), and are stalked by a machete brandishing lunatic who has stitched pieces of his victims' faces together, wearing them as a mask, and bringing moronic thought processes to light - seems the dumber you are in this movie, the longer you'll last - utter absurdity.


