DO YOU TAKE THIS MAN

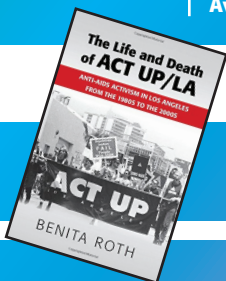

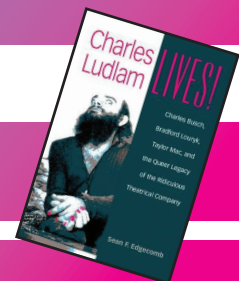
