

➤ Rock/opera hybrid group East Village Opera Company will release a new album of amplified and electrified opera masterpieces on Old School due Aug. 12 on Decca. Led by creators Peter Kiesewalter and Tyley Ross, East Village Opera Company takes some of the most recognizable arias by giants like Wagner, Handel, Verdi, Bach and Puccini and re-imagine them as rock epics, using a full symphony orchestra and R&B horns. Lead singer Ross and arranger/multi-instrumentalist Kiesewalter co-founded EVOC after meeting in 2001 while working on the soundtrack for a feature film in Canada. The director's request to "let me hear Italian opera in a way that hasn't been done before" was the seed that eventually led the two to form the group. 
