Folk concert

White Bird is not part of the set performed on Incredible String Band Live at the Lowry, an MVDvisual release (UPC#022891459194, \$20), so be warned. Instead they sing numbers such as Ducks on a Pond or Cousin Caterpillar, which would not be out of place at a Raffi concert. The group's focus on folk music carries over to the antiqueness of some of their instruments and the roughly hewn harmonies they create singing and playing together. That the DVD has a 5.1-channel Dolby Digital track only serves to emphasize the deliberate lack of slick processing in the show's recording, which can make you cringe unless you keep the program at a modest volume. Fans will certainly appreciate the 98-minute show, which was shot in 2003, because of the clarity and immediacy that is conveyed by the crisp full screen images and loose staging, but casual viewers will be less enamored with the show and more apt to sample it in segments instead of attempting to take it all in at once. There is no captioning. Along with a text profile of the group, there is a fairly nice 23-minute interview with band members Mike Heron and Clive Palmer.

The Devil gets his due from Something Weird

The Devil is a primary character in both of the softcore burlesque programs paired on the Chiller Theatre Something Weird Video release, The Joys of Jezebel/My Tale Is Hot (UPC#014381360028, \$20). In the 1970 Jezebel, which is performed rather satisfyingly in Biblical-era costumes, the title character leaves Hell to trade places with a virginal princess so she can take revenge—and physical pleasure—upon the men who did her wrong in her mortal life. She also plays a fast one on the Devil by hiding the virgin, so the Devil has to search through Hell—encountering all sorts of odd goings on—to find her and get what he wants. The film's sex is harmless, and the 75-minute program has a nice psychedelic atmosphere that should please any viewer who is open to the genre to begin with.

The 1964 My Tale Is Hot is a little dumber and more specifically vaudevillian, although its basic premise is admirable—the Devil comes to Earth to tempt what turns out to be a good-hearted man (although his squat appearance had suggested otherwise), and is foiled with each trick he tries, but not before a bevy of mid-Sixties beauties is paraded topless before the camera. Running 58 minutes, the film is over before it becomes too tiresome, and while it is not as directly stimulating as Jezebel, its cheap sets and cue card

acting have their own charms.

The full screen color source material on Jezebel is in adequate condition, with bright colors and reasonable coherency. Colors look fresh at times on the full screen My Tale Is Hot, but there is a substantial amount of wear to the source material, and many punchlines are lost to splices. On both,

the monophonic sound is scratchy and there is no captioning.

Additionally, a 54-minute African-American Harlemwood Studios production from 1944 entitled *Go Down, Death!* has been included. It is about a jazzt club owner (there are some terrific music and dance numbers) who attempts to corrupt a local preacher after the preacher's sermons depress his business, and concludes with a wonderfully phantasmagorical sequence in which the jazz owner gets his own taste of Hell (including a rather Hebrew-looking Devil). The full black-and-white source material is in fairly rough shape, as is the monophonic sound, but the film's inclusion in the collection is still satisfying.

Also featured are six Devil-related trailers, a standard 8-minute montage of exploitation film promotional art set to exploitation film music, a 3-minute black-and-white strip clip showing Candy Barr admiring herself in and out of a nightgown in front of a mirror, and a great 8-minute color cartoon without title cards (it is called *Satan in Church* on the DVD's menu) that depicts a conflict between church hierarchy and the Devil's influences in an abstract, European-looking two-dimensional style.

As for other Fox/MGM releases, Erik the Viking will be recut to 75 minutes and accompanied by a Terry Jones commentary track. Rescue Dawn will have a commentary by Werner Herzog, deleted scenes and a production featurette. The Simpsons Movie will have two commentaries, deleted scenes and a number of other humorous features.

TRANSFORMERS DETAILS: DreamWorks Home Entertainment's Transformers will have a Michael Bay commentary and extensive production featurettes.

THIRTEEN SUPPLEMENTS: Warner Home Video's Ocean's
Thirteen will have deleted scenes and a number of production featurettes.


