MVD Entertainment Group has announced an October 1, 2013 release date for "Going Underground: Paul McCartney, the Beatles and the U.K. Counter Culture," a new documentary film that traces the history of the British underground scene in the mid-1960s. The film, to be released in DVD format, focuses on the collective of young radicals operating in London at the time, particularly those involved with hipster publication The International Times, and how their actions introduced new social, sexual and aesthetic perspectives that effected already established bands like the Beatles, their fans and the nation's youth in general.

"Going Underground" tells its story through rare archival footage and newly-taped interview segments; among the luminaries contributing to the new material are Paul McCartney confidante Barry Miles, John "Hoppy" Hopkins of The International Times, Pink Floyd producer Joe Boyd, Robert Wyatt of band the Soft Machine, scenester and vocalist for the Deviants Mick Farren, Beatles expert Chris Ingram and Mark Paytress, journalist for rock mag Mojo.

Photographs from private collections and <u>music</u> from Pink Floyd, the Beatles, Soft Machine and experimental collective AMM also features in "Going Underground."
