### NIGHT SCHOOL: An Evening With Stanley Clarke and Friends

\$19.98; Heads Up. This is a starstudded DVD with guest performances by Stevie Wonder, Wallace Roney, Bela Fleck, Sheila E., Stewart Copeland, Flea, Marcus Miller and more. It captures performances that range from straightahead jazz to full-tilt rock fusion to 22-piece string arrangements.

#### **BLOOD SWEAT & TEARS: Spinning** Wheel

\$19.95; Cherry Red. BS&T was the first and best of the jazz-rock horn bands. With David Clayton-Thomas leading the band, BS&T epitomized post-60's eclecticism. "Spinning Wheel" features a full live show from the band's 1980 UK

#### **RONNIE HAWKINS: Still Alive &** Kickin'

\$19.95; Casablanca Int'l. Narrated by Dan Aykroyd, this film celebrates Ronnie Hawkins, the man, his life and his music. It features excerpts of live performances and classic Hawk hits. It follows a year in The Hawks



life, from his diagnosed with terminal pancreatic cancer to his miraculous cure. Everybody is pulled into this truly unbelievable time in the life of this living music legend.

#### BEST OF THE GLEN CAMPBELL MUSIC SHOW

\$12.95; Cherry Red. This DVD represents the best performances from a string of concerts in the early 70's, the peak of Campbell's career. From a recording of a show at The Talk of the Town in '72, then 6 TV shows through '75. The performances are tight, sound recording excellent, and include his best known hits and covers.

#### **BIG AUDIO DYNAMITE - Live: E=** Mc2

**\$19.95; Cherry Red.** Shot in 1990 at London, England's Town & Country Club, this DVD features a sell-out concert by B.A.D.II. Mick Jones and his posse pull out all the

stops with a mesmerising performance. In '84, B.A.D.II assembled to combine rock, reggae, hiphop, beatbox and hi-tech, setting a new standard in music production values.

FRANKIE LAINE: That Old Lucky Sun \$12.95; Cherry Red. This DVD features a full Frankie Laine concert from a 1976 tour of the UK, and includes the hit songs That Old Lucky Sun, Jezebel, Jealousy, and more. As one of the most popular vocalists of the 1950s, Laine performed swinging jazz standards as

well as several Western movie themes with his manly baritone. He sold more than 250 million discs worldwide.

THE KILLERS: Leaving Las Vegas \$19.95; Pride. This is a documentary film using interviews with the band and THE KILLER those close to them, with rare performance footage, numerous obscure photographs, location shoots and a host of other features. Extras include: Full interactive digital discography, exclusive gaming feature, and the hardest Killers quiz in the world ever and beyond DVD section.

#### LIVE AT THE ROCK N ROLL PALACE Starring: Various Artists; \$12.95; MVD Visual.

The DVD features Johnny Thunder ("Loop De Loop"), Johnny Tillotson (26 hits between '58 and '65), The Crickets (originally backed Buddy Holly), The Diamonds (who sold a ton of cover records), Tommy Sands (clean cut rock 'n roll), Bobby Vee (38 songs in the Billboard Top 100), The Platters (doo-wop), and Ace Cannon (saxophone virtuoso).
