

In their 40th year, a 19th LP documents a broken world over roots, reggae, dub, DJ.



There are two UB40 incarnations. One, featuring co-founders Ali Campbell,

Astro and Mickey Virtue, follows the Labour Of Love covers path. This one, led by Ali's brother Duncan Campbell and featuring original members (and third brother) Robin Campbell, Brian Travers, Jimmy Brown, Earl Falconer and Norman Hassan, takes a tougher musical route as they reconnect with their socialist roots on a first album of original songs since 2008's twentyfourseven. The title is a nod to Jeremy Corbyn's Labour, which they support. Meanwhile, the 10 songs here, a mix of love and politics, touch hearts, minds and feet with tough, edgy rhythms, bubbling synths and dubby effects - and, in the case of their graphic indictment of

war and hunger All We Do Is Cry, a children's choir.
