Big release this week: "Avatar." However, it has NO EXTRAS, so you might just want to rent it for now and wait until the Special Edition comes out in November. Also big this week: "Crazy Heart," "The Lovely Bones," "The Young Victoria."

Usual rules apply: synopses are taken from the press releases, snarky commentary is extra, and preview links go to Apple.com. And just in case you were wondering, the DVD prices are the listed retail prices. You can get them cheaper if you buy at discount stores or online.

Fox, 162 minutes, PG-13 (Release date: April 22 - Earth Day)

DVD: \$29.98

BD: \$39.99

I don't really have to describe this one, do I? Well, just in case: James Cameron returns after 12 years of waiting for the technology to catch up to make his big statement about the greed of mankind. The big bad Earth corporation wants to mine a precious substance from the planet Pandora. Paraplegic Marine Jake (Sam Worthington) gets the chance to walk again when he operates a 9-foot tall avatar that allows him to pass as one of the N'avi, the peaceful inhabitants of the planet. He's initially doing recon for the grizzled general (Stephen Lang) on the N'avi, but he grows to like the natives, especially the feisty Neytiri (Zoe Saldana). Also stars Sigourney Weaver. No extras on the discs, but there's plenty of stuff online. And a special edition release is scheduled for November, so you might want to just rent it now and buy it later.

Crazy Heart

Fox. 111 minutes. R

DVD: \$29.98

Jeff Bridges won Best Actor for his portrayal of Bad Blake, a boozy, broken-down country singer who seeks redemption and a comeback with the help of Jean (Maggie Gylllenhaal), a journalist. His protégé, Tommy Sweet (Colin Farrell) offers him that shot, but can he subdue his healthy ego to make it work? Also stars Robert Duvall as his favorite bartender. Adapted from the novel by Thomas Cobb. Extras: deleted scenes, alternate music cuts. BD adds a few more deleted scenes, interviews

Deadly Impact

MGM, 96 minutes, not rated, \$22.98

Cop Thomas Armstrong (Sean Patrick Flanery) joins the FBI after an assassin (Joe Pantoliano) targets him; now he has to find a way to stop him before he threatens an entire city. Unrated release probably means that it didn't garner enough enthusiasm for at theatrical release. No extras listed.

Jordon Saffron: Taste This

Synergetics, 87 minutes, R, \$19.98

Mockumentary about Jordon Saffron (Sergio Meyers, who also directs) is a big-time Hollywood chef with a "secret ingredient" that makes women swoon. But too much partying and not enough cooking leads to the loss of his girlfriend (Rachel Hunter), his restaurant, his cooking show partner (Steve Schirripa), and his sense of taste. He goes back to his dad's pizza place in Chicago to find out where everything went wrong. No extras listed.

The Lovely Bones

Paramount, 121 minutes, PG-13

DVD: \$19.99 BD: \$29.99

When 14-year-old Susie Salmon (Saoirse Ronan) was murdered, her unfinished life was left behind. But she's stuck in limbo, so she has to help her father (Mark Walberg) catch her killer and protect her family before moving on. Peter Jackson's long-awaited return to the director's chair (after "King Kong" and the "Lord of the Rings" trilogy) didn't sit too well with critics and some fans; they felt he took some wrong detours in the adaptation of Alice Sebold's popular novel. No extras on the DVD, but the BD has a 15-part production diary.

Merlin: The Complete First Season

BBC Video, 13 episodes, 5 discs, \$49.98

New version of the Arthurian legend focuses on the sorcerer (Richard Wilson). Extras: making-of featurettes, video diaries, photo galleries.

Minority Report

Paramount, 146 minutes, PG-13, \$29.95 (BD debut)

Steven Spielberg's adaptation of the Philip K. Dick short story has Tom Cruise as a cop in the year 2054. He works for the Department of Pre-Crime, which uses mutants that can see into the future to predict murders before they happen. Cruise has to stop them before they happen. Things take a twist when he's named one of the pre-crime suspects. Six of the extras are in HD, so they might be new.

The Rolling Stones: Rare and Unseen

MVD Entertainment/Wienerworld, 64 minutes, \$14.95

Just what the title says: rare and unseen footage of the World's Greatest Rock & Roll Band. No extras listed.

Neoclassics, 89 minutes, PG-13, \$19.98
