

The Rolling Stones - Under Review 1975-1983: The Ronnie Wood Years, Pt. 1 (Sexy Intellectual/Chrome Dreams UK/MVD Visual)

Is a nine-part documentary – with each installment clocking in at around two hours apiece - enough to tell the story of The Rolling Stones? Well, that depends on how much Stones is too much Stones or how much Stones is never enough Stones for your taste. For my money, the quality of the 'Under Review' series seems to be just right. The producers have a clear love for the band and have made this for fans, meaning that criticism is kept to a minimum and is largely constructive in nature, while offered praise is well-meaning and never seems to cross the line into being sycophantic. What we have here is actually the first part of the series that I've seen so far, covering the years 1975-1983 and featuring an emphasis on the reason that these years were specifically chosen: the introduction and indoctrination of guitarist Ronnie Wood as a member of 'the greatest rock 'n' roll band in the world'. By incorporating a fantastic mix of archival footage, photographs, and interviews with a well-rounded panel of talking heads - including renowned music critics Robert Christgau, Anthony DeCurtis, Paul Gambaccini, Nigel Williamson, Mark Paytress, and Barney Hoskyns, plus musician Sugar Blue, in addition to narrator Thomas Arnold – the filmmakers capture the mood and the mojo of the wild and crazy 1970s in fine fashion. During this period, the Stones released a slew of albums that are not always given a high level of credence by most Stones archivists and aficionados, but mean as much to me - as a child of the 70s, this was the period when I discovered the band, after all - as anything else in their extensive discography: 'Black And Blue', 'Some Girls', 'Emotional Rescue', 'Tattoo You', and

'Undercover', plus the live albums 'Love You Live' and 'Still Life (American Concert 1981)'. The filmmakers take an in-depth look at the culture of – and around – the band, and how/why it was shifting and churning, during the recording, release, and tours surrounding each of these releases. The key elements of the 1975-83 Stones, at least as far as the filmmakers are concerned, were, in order: New York City (where the band was predominantly located during this period), drugs (go figure), and Ronnie Wood. Or was the single key element the same thing that it always has been and always will be: the love/hate/love relationship between Mick Jagger and Keith Richards? Both aspects are covered extensively, and I am definitely not qualified to get into the middle of the Mick vs. Keith argument - I'm a big fan of knowing my lane and staying in it – but the supporting documentation makes it fairly clear that Jagger had a firmer grip on the wheel during this period than anyone else in the band. For me, the most enjoyable aspects of this film come from revisiting – I'd hate to use the word 'nostalgia' – this period of music in general, and this period of the Stones specifically. How many times did I watch the videos for 'Undercover Of The Night' and 'She Was Hot', or the concert film 'Let's Spend The Night Together', through period sources like MTV and USA's Night Flight? How badly did my pre-teen self want to experience the live spectacle of the band's massive 1981 tour? The Impaler's verdict: I'd call this film mandatory viewing for anyone who, like me, experienced this period of The Rolling Stones during his or her formative years for sure, and highly recommended viewing for everyone else with even a cursory interest in the kingpins of rock 'n' roll. Extra features on the DVD include an in-depth interview with Sugar Blue, a blues musician who joined the Stones on harmonica during this period, and biographies on the critics providing commentary throughout the film.
