Paramount

OMG! George Clooney's stupid suspenseful thriller Suburbicon (BD + Digital) is an unacceptable misfire that poorly attempts to juggle social satire, racial observation, and a murder mystery -- and ends up making a disarray of all three.

Welcome to bad taste as the collaboration with Clooney (Writer/Director) and the disappointing Coen Brothers offers an idyllic white town of Suburbicon that's a perfect place for Gardner Lodge (Matt Damon) to make a home! However, beware because he's not what he seems to appear at all! He's mostly a bad family man with a lust for his wife's (Julianne More- playing both roles in tacky Dark Brown and Blond wigs) perfect sister. It's the classic TV sitcom "Father Knows Best" meets "Guess Who's Coming To Dinner," except the guest are upper-class 1959 Negros moving into Suburbicon where they are tormented by a rousing (and over-the-top) white crowd of protesting! The use of Rebel flags and riots are too much in a film that distorts decent Caucasians who want to remain isolated from the world. What a film to put out that aims to discredit POTUS and our rights when African- Americans are the one's demonstrating in the streets today, paid by militants, to rally over Civil War Monuments, and here in New Orleans, three were desecrated and removed to a trash bin to the tune of eight million dollars! Catch up Mr. Clooney! Suburbicon is laborious to watch as a break-in leads to the shocking murder of Gardner's wife, and the Detective knows he did it! This is a tale of very flawed people making very bad choices, including Clooney! Moore, a wonderful actress is wasted in a double role and acts as if she's a member of "The Stepford Wives' Club!" (1975 & 2004). Don't ask for coffee, she'll put Lye in it! This 2017 film laid a rotten egg at theaters and really belongs in the trash bin instead of on Blu-ray! Here is another superb classic refurbished to shine in Blu-ray and even looks so crisp you'd think it was in 4K! I'm talking about the Sci-Fi Fantasy The Aftermath (BD + DVD). You may ask yourself "What comes after World War




III?" This cult classic is from 1982 and explores a post-apocalyptic world that was originally banned in the UK. But wait, it is a really interesting film with plenty of spectacular action. A spaceship returns from deep space to find the Earth in The Aftermath of a nuclear and biological war. The streets are filled with mutated survivors feeding off the weak and a Manson-like figure called Cutter, Sid Haig, The Devil's Rejects (2005), House of 1000 Corpses (2003), Jackie Brown (1997) is reigning terror down on all others. Cutter and his gang of mercenary thugs are systematically murdering all the male survivors and enslaving women and children. Most of his targets are easy, but all that changes when Cutter confronts astronaut Newman (Steve Barkett, Empire of the Dark, Dinosaur Island, Dark Universe), and the woman Sarah (Lynn Margulies) he finds and falls in love with, and the young child Chris (Christopher Barkett, Empire of the Dark). What follows is a cat and mouse game of violent and spectacular proportions with no less than Earth's survival in the balance.
