Indie Pix Film Festival Favorites, Volume 4

Here we go again with these multiple "Indie Pix Film Festival Favorites, Volume 4!" Here is the short low-down on these compelling International acclaimed, Award-Winning entries:



1. So Bright Is The View (DVD). In present day Bucharest, Estera, a middle class Jewish girl, is presented with a choice between pursuing a job in Atlanta or joining her mother in Israel. Her glass-ceiling data entry job only offers so much, while she yearns to advance her career. She secretly is expecting a baby, while trying hard to work out some sort of future with her boyfriend, Vlad. Her father is in prison for unspecified crimes and her mother is about to be evicted. Then a hopeful opportunity appears in a friend-interview with Mike, a Romanian-American, who reveals himself to be an uncouth bully who may have a job offer.

2. Soldate Jeanette (DVD). Austrian director Daniel Hoesl takes the reins for this eccentric comedy with a satirical edge. Here is a portrait of two women from different ends of the social spectrum. Meet Fanni (Johanna Orsini-Rosenberg), a member of the Viennese bourgeois who tires of leisure life and on the eve of her eviction, runs to the mountains and burns all her money!! There she finds herself involved in a livestock farm where she takes a shine to Anna (Christina Reichsthaler) a rebellious farm girl, they team up and go on an unknown newfound liberty and search for their perfect dreams!

3. A Blast (DVD) tells the story of a generation's disillusionment and radicalization. Maria (Angeliki Papoulia) started her adult life with the best of intentions. After ten years, her world is cracking into nothingness! Greece's ongoing financial crisis has forced people everywhere to reevaluate their expectations of the world. Maria is unwilling to reconcile as she attacks her past, the people she loves, her country and the perception of her sex in a relentless battle to find truth, both in her and around her. A Blast is a film that jumps back and forth between the present and a series of vignettes from an undefined past, is the frantic, unsettling and intriguing record of Maria's journey.
