Johnson following the success of the Oil City Confidential movie. Not undeservedly either, as recent gigs have shown them to be well on rocking form.

With no new album and a major tour in the offing, this stop-gap release brings together ten of the best from their recent studio albums, plus a further ten live tracks. While the studio recordings pack a punch, displaying some particularly fiery lead guitar, singer and sole original member Barrie Masters occasionally sounds a little subdued. A cover of lan Hunter's 'Once Bitten, Twice Shy' suits him down to the ground, though.

On the live recordings, however,
Masters has definitely got his mojo
working. It's a typical Hot Rods greatest
hits set, featuring the classics 'Do
Anything You Wanna Do', 'Teenage
Depression', and the usual sprinkling
of boozer-friendly covers including a
storming 'Hard Drivin' Man'. Nothing
unfamiliar to the casual observer, then,
but it's a ferocious mix that solidly
underlines — doubly, in marker-pen — their
enduring prowess as a live act.
