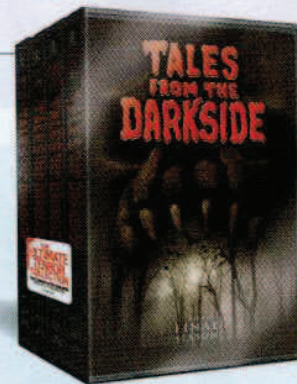
Wolverine and the X-Men: The Complete Series

This terror triptych features Danny Boyle's 2003 zombie (okay, okay, it's technically a "rage virus") flick, its 2007 sequel, and, because there's no *28 Months Later*, Alexandre Aja's 2008 film about murderous mirrors. **(R, \$20.49*)**
