I love 1970's horror movies, so when I saw that the Ed Adlum directed Invasion of the Blood Farmers was being released, I was quite excited to check it out. Let me preface the movie review by saying that this one deserves a place beside such movies as Manos, Hands of Fate and Truth or Dare: A Critical Madness as solid entries in the "So Bad It's Good" hall of fame. If you are one who does not enjoy this special form of badly done cinema then this movie is not going to be your cup of tea. Personally, I had an absolute blast watching it and am proud to have it in my DVD collection.

In upstate New York, a sleepy town is upended when a rogue band of Druids revive their practices of harvesting human blood in order to bring their ancient Queen of the Sangroid back to life. To aid in their blood harvesting, the druids (who are actually a race of aliens..yes, seriously!) have an additive that causes human blood cells to reproduce and multiply until the host explodes. A scientist and his young partner, who is dating the scientist's daughter, must race to determine the cause of this blood virus and solve the mystery of the disappearing townspeople before the druid aliens revive their queen and take over the earth.

This movie is just insane. From the pumps and hoses hooked up to the Druid victims to the ridiculous Amish looking Druid

who lurks throughout the movie looking for victims, it is pure cheese heaven. The acting is amateur as this is a low budget movie and the stone faced delivery style as characters read their cue cards in pure monotone is absolutely hilarious. My favorite laugh though is when the movie obviously switches dogs mid-movie and then try to pass it off as the same dog. There are just so many things that will keep you laughing throughout the horribly scripted film.

As I have said in the past, Cheezy Flicks does a great job at digging out these obscure cult movies and releasing them very inexpensively. Invasion of the Blood Farmers is another classic that they have unearthed and fans of 70s cinema owe it to themselves to check it out. 
