She could jump out of a moving, burning car, chop up a Boy George doll with an axe on stage, or sing "Butcher Baby," as Wendy O Williams of the Plasmatics. Now she can sit on your desk in her full leather gear and mohawk.

Aggronautix is releasing their very first female throbblehead, "Wendy O. Williams 1982," in the limited capacity of 2000 numbered units. The collectors item is expected to sell out quickly.

The figurine captures Wendy's incredibly sexy 1982 look. Standing at 7 inches tall, the throbblehead is made of a lightweight polyresin. Displayed in a tri-windowed box, having worked out and been a vegetarian, she is sculpted right down to the platinum blonde mohawk, spiked arm bands, and her tattered threads.

The throbblehead figure will be distributed by MVD Entertainment Group - a company specializing in music-related distribution since 1986 - and DKE Toys - a wholesale distributor of urban, vinyl, designer art objects, toys and figurines.

Wendy is the sixth punk personality to be polyresinated by Aggronautix. In May, 2009, Aggronautix launched its cultishly popular GG Allin "1991" figure, which has sold out.
