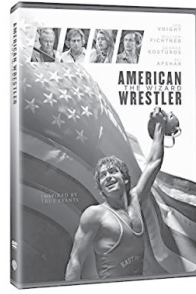
The fifth (and final) installment of Jack Sparrow is a loving tribute to the amazing Walt Disney attraction in Disneyland, and was created near New Orleans' Square, where you can dine at the Blue Bayou Restaurant as you watch the pirate boat float by your dinner table before entering the attraction! And only Walt could set the Caribbean near his recreation of a better French Quarter, cleaner, proper and peaceful than our original filth and crime laden debauchery run by an outrageous loony Mayor Mitch Landrieu who should see a psychiatrist after removing, what "he thinks is four Civil War Monuments," that has offended 67 percent of African Americans (?) for over 100 years! All the spectacular effects Walt's Imagineers created are highlighted in this marvelous 3-D film that pops with excitement despite lukewarm reviews from most critics. However, the public embraced the zombie sharks, supernatural skeletons, cannon explosions at sea and other marvelous special effects and has earned a whopping \$62.6 million in just one week! If you go on this ride, just remember, it's the fun, not the plot that counts! Johnny Depp returns to the big screen as the iconic, rumbustious anti-hero Jack Sparrow in the all-new "Pirates of the Caribbean: Dead Men Tell No Tales" (Walt Disney Pictures). The rip-roaring adventure finds down-on-his-luck Captain Jack feeling the winds of ill-fortune blowing strongly his way when deadly ghost sailors, led by the terrifying Captain Salazar (Javier Bardem), escape from the Devil's Triangle bent on killing every pirate at sea-notably Jack. Jack's only hope of survival lies in the legendary Trident of Poseidon, but to find it he must forge an uneasy alliance with Carina Smyth (Kaya Scodelario), a brilliant and beautiful astronomer, and Henry (Brenton Thwaites), a headstrong young sailor in the Royal Navy. At the helm of the Dying Gull, his pitifully small and shabby ship, Captain Jack seeks not only to reverse his recent spate of ill fortune, but to save his very life from the most formidable and malicious foe he has ever faced. The climactic stormy sea-parting finale should win a prize and proves CEO Bob Iger did something right for a change in making more Disney sequels. Also look for a cameo buy of all people, Paul McCartney, and stay for the entire credits for a special spooky surprise that may suggest a spin off in another direction!

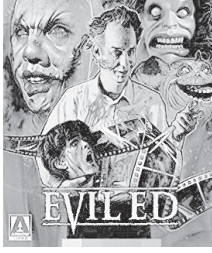

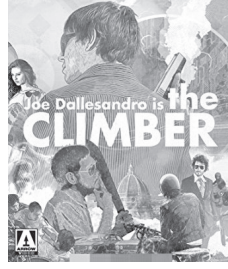
