

Keen directed Van's screenplay that was also co-authored by Evan Susser (Funny or Die's "What's Going On? With Mike Mitchell"), and the comedy was developed from their original story along with a third writer named Max Greenfield. Clever creative writing turns an ordinary school day into a circus! On the last day of the year, mild-mannered high school English teacher Andy Campbell (Day) is trying his best to keep it together amidst senior pranks, a dysfunctional administration and budget cuts that put jobs on the line. But things go from bad to worse when he accidentally crosses his much tougher and deeply feared colleague, Ron Strickland (Ice Cube), who challenges Campbell to an old-fashioned throw down after school. News of the fight spreads like wildfire and ends up becoming the very thing this school, and Campbell, needed. I personally thought it was a really funny movie in which Ice Cube and Charlie worked the material very well together. I did find that the characters and action were a bit over-the-top, plus the students were intentionally unruly and that allows you to laugh at all the gags and inanity. 
