




Years later, the damn thing was out on video, haunting me, taunting me. However, the last thing I wanted to do was watch Re-Animator in the privacy of my own home. At that point, I was ready to see it in a crowded movie theater surrounded by other well-dressed, popcorn-filled

'fraidy-cats. I was not, however, ready to watch it in the relative safety and comfort of an empty house. Certainly not one in my neighborhood.

Fool.

When Malibu acquired the license from producer Brian Yuzna (a very nice guy who, on the phone, talks faster than even I do), I could wait no longer. I prepared myself by reading the screenplay, then collected all of my friends together for an evening of Re-Animator

viewing.

Re-Animator was everything my friends had said it was six years earlier, only it was also more. Sure, there were moments of genuine terror and shock and some outstanding gore effects, but there was also wit, style and charm. Director Stuart Gordon (who would go on to work on Honey, I Shrunk The Kids) was a master at making this low-budget thriller look like it cost many times its original budget (which has been reported at less than \$1 million). The dialogue crackled and the winning performance of Jeffrey Combs as Herbert West showed the making of a true star. (And who would have guessed that naked Barbara Crampton would go on to become a major soap-opera actress?).

The Re-Animator is still out there, lurking in your video store. Buy it. Rent it. Watch it. Don't be a fool.

Just make sure you read the comic book version first.
